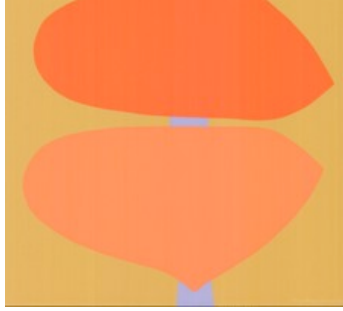
### **Lesley Centenarian Marjorie Truesdell Servis Leaves Legacy for Future Students**
